Founded on a heritage of volunteerism, our purpose is to serve ...

Sunnyside was built by volunteer efforts and provided opportunities for volunteerism in the early years. Today that same spirit survives, exemplified by the actions of our residents, staff, supporters and affiliated churches.



191 volunteers contributed **6,847** hours

223 trips for residents were provided by volunteer resident drivers

Our Mission is to serve ...

A significant benefit to Sunnyside residents is the Sunnyside Foundation. The Foundation's mission supports residents in financial need but it provides more than grants; hundreds of residents each year are equipped with free services and resources. The Foundation provides critical advocacy to assist residents in problem solving through many life issues including fraud prevention and estate planning. The Foundation also aids the broader Sarasota community, especially families in crisis, with donations of household essentials and furniture. This year, the Foundation contributed to 15 local charities and assisted residents managing their donor advised funds of more than \$41,000 to aid regional and international missions.

Last year, attendance of worship services and chapel events exceeded 9,500 participants.





Sunnyside's Christian environment, lush landscaped neighborhood and quality care attract people annually to discover what the Village offers. Referrals from friends and residents stimulated another record-breaking year for new inquiries. Our Future Resident Program offers 55 and older adults the opportunity to reserve a position for residency and receive exclusive invitations to Village events, wellness programs, workshops and meals. This past year, 108 new future residents joined the wait list increasing the total to 343 applicants.

Staff Engagement Survey

Every couple of years Sunnyside evaluates the

satisfaction of residents and staff through impartial surveys. The surveys are conducted by Holleran Consulting, a senior living industry leader. This year, the survey focused on employee engagement to the mission and the organization. Holleran ranked Sunnyside Village Highest Honors in three areas:

- Staff engagement totaled 84%, exceeding the Holleran National Benchmark score of 80%
- 65% of Sunnyside Village employees are highly engaged and committed to the organization compared to 43% on the national benchmark
- Staff satisfaction ranked 86%, four percentage points above the Holleran benchmark of 82%

"We Care" Award






Our Mission is to enrich...




