Update to Village Independent Living Residents and Staff

So, who should know when someone contracts the coronavirus? That is a huge question that lurks in the back of all our heads – and it is not a fun one to address. But there are some serious considerations to keep in mind.

- If you become symptomatic with the virus or test positive with the virus, you should contact Terrie Kimbrell or me immediately. You will be asked to start your 14-day quarantine immediately. Others' well-being depends on your quarantine. We will guide you through the next steps. Your health is a major priority – so is the health of others!

Daily living with the virus in our community requires diligent, persistent, and responsible behavior patterns.

- As we go through our daily activities, keep in mind that many people have the coronavirus but are asymptomatic. So, it is essential to continue to use safe and healthy practices:
 - Wash your hands for 20 – 30 seconds **FREQUENTLY** during your day
 - Wear your face covering whenever you are in a common area or within 6 feet of another person inside. Masks are optional outside if you are socially distanced.
 - Distance at least 6 feet when you are close to another person
- Wear a face mask when staff comes to your home.
- Transportation staff will begin taking the temperature of the residents before transporting them to appointments. If the temperature is above 99.6 degrees, the resident will not be allowed on the bus or transported in the vehicle.

Coronavirus update:

The staff member that tested positive two weeks ago developed symptoms – all the precautions and protocol for this situation are in place. Residents and staff in the proximity of this staff member have been notified and asked to monitor themselves for the next week.

Visitation guidance:

- **Permitted on Campus** – residents, staff, medical personnel, caregivers, approved housekeepers, local friends and family members, campus service providers, trades, and federal agency personnel.
- **Visit neighbors** in your homes or outside, practicing social or physical distancing. Walk or meet up outdoors with proper physical distancing/face coverings when within 6-10 feet of others.
- **Family and friends from off campus** should go directly to your home, wear face coverings while on campus and not remain in any common areas. Physically distanced walks around the campus are acceptable.

Regarding common areas in the Garden Apartments:

- Face coverings are required in all common areas including, hallways, elevators, and lobbies.
- Please do not use the first-floor lobby areas to visit with family, friends, or neighbors.
- Second and third-floor common areas should not be used at this time for meetings, games, or gatherings, but are acceptable locations for small, quiet conversations if physically distanced.
- Be courteous to those neighbors who live near the common areas by keeping your noise levels moderated.

Sunnyside Village Chapel services have limited, distanced seating: Wednesday, at 10:30 a.m., Sunday at 10:30 a.m., and rebroadcast campus-wide on Sunday on both Channel 195 and 103 at 10:30 a.m.

Christian Life Class, at 10:30 a.m. in the Chapel. All safety and distancing parameters will be in effect, as the worship services.

When you order restaurant food deliveries, be sure your name and address are on the delivery packages. We have had pizza and great food delivered to 5201 Bahia Vista Street, and we never did find out who ordered it.

- Transportation to essential medical appointments at no charge if you do not own a car, have quit driving, or have not left campus since March 16 – call Ext. 266
- The chapel is reserved for staff coronavirus testing on Mondays for the foreseeable future
- Bank hours are back to normal
- Exercise classes have resumed. Check the Activity calendar, Channel 195, or the *SunnysideConnect* app for the schedule
